PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

LOCATION:

Trivenidevi Bhalotia College is a Govt-sponsored college, situated in Raniganj town, which is the South-Eastern neighbourhood in Asansol sadar sub-division of Paschim Bardhaman district in the state of West Bengal.

ABOUT THE COLLEGE:

A multi faculty college, this college initiated its journey from 1957 as an affiliated college under the University of Calcutta. However it became affiliated to the University of Burdwan in 1960. The college presently came under the aegis of Kazi Nazrul University on 24th June 2015. This institution is co-educational and has the morning and day sections.

CAMPUS:

The College has an aesthetically appealing sprawling beautiful green campus covering approximately 15 acres of land. The campus includes academic buildings, residential hostel for boys and staff quarters. It also houses a branch of a Nationalized Bank. Besides, the campus provides an open air stage in the vicinity of the central library in the south- eastern fringe. This auditorium is used during the annual social as well as for various cultural activities organized by the students and staff.

LIBRARY:

The college owes a separate central Library Building designed to cater to the college's current and future teaching and research interests. The primary mission of the library is to support the educational program of the college by providing access to rich physical and digital repositories of learning resources. It has a very rich and unique collection of approximately 85000 books, ancient manuscripts, periodicals, magazines and journals for reading, referencing or borrowing. There are reading and lending facilities in the library. There are individual libraries in the department which the students can access at the discretion of the departmental faculty. The INFLIBNET facility allows the students to have easy access in browsing and for reference work. The library also provides a quiet and peaceful reading room that is conducive for learning and referencing. With the vast stock of old and rare books as well as the growing maintenance demands, plans for further infrastructural developments and expansion are underway.

HOSTEL:

Hallmark of a good institution is its ability to provide excellent amenities beside quality education. Our institution provides hostel facilities for the boys. The boys' hostel building is constructed at the north eastern corner of the college campus accommodating 100 boys. All the amenities are well provided for the healthy living condition that provides confidence in favour of learning.

OPEN-AIR THEATRE:

The open-air theatre - "Binoy Chowdhury Mancha" - is meant for organizing cultural programs, annual functions, reunions of Departments and other programs; in which group gathering may be required. The open-air theatre has the capacity to accommodate around 2000 spectators comfortably at a time.

PLAY SCAPE :

The college has playground where regular sports & games like, football and cricket matches are conducted. Besides this, there is also a Badminton and Volley Ball court where the students practice regularly. The Play scape also provides a safe and green environment.

COMMON ROOM:

Separate common room for both boys and girls to provide warm welcoming place, a perfect blend of fun and function. A space for the students of the college to hold meetings study or simply relax, the common room is always bustling with students reflecting the whole spectrum of activity of the students.

NATIONALIZED BANK:

A branch of the Syndicate Bank is serving the teachers, staff and students of the college campus. The branch has CBS facility.

PLACEMENT CELL AND CAREER GUIDANCE CELL:

The career Guidance Cell at TDB college functions under the direct control and direction of the Principal of the college. A team of professors work together to guide the students on various career opportunities. The objective of the cell is to identify the talents available among the students of this college and nurture and harness them further; offering guidance to choose a brightand right career.

The activities of the cell include collecting the database of the students and compilling them for use, when needed. The cell guides the students and improves their skill to face various competitive exams an interviews. The career guidance cell organizes seminars and meetings to encourage the students to plan their future. The cell invites reputed companies to the campus to conduct campus interview and find suitable jobs for the skill available among the students. The cell also facilitates the economically weaker sections of the students of first and second year undergraduate courses to find suitable part time jobs to supplement the family income without affecting the academic pursuit.

COLLEGE CANTEEN:

The canteen is situated within the college campus adjacent to the main entrance of the college. It is open for all and there are separate dining arrangements for students and staff. All types of snacks, soft drinks, meals are available at the subsidized rates. The canteen hour is from 7:30 a.m. to 6 pm every day.

ACTIVITIES

STUDENTS' UNION:

The college is proud of its NCC unit has reached praiseworthy heights. NCC unit actively participates in social activities like blood donation, tree plantation and natural calamity relief programs under the able guidance of Dr.Ganesh Rajak, the NCC officer of our esteemed college.

NATIOTNAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS):

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is an Indian government-sponsored public service program conducted by the ministry of youth Affairs and Sports of the Government of India. Aimed at developing student's personality through community service, NSS is a voluntary association of young people in colleges, universities working for a campus community linkage. The college has two units of NSS for boys and girls separately under the able leadership of Professor Joyesh Rajguru and Professor Arunima Karmakar respectively.

The NSS units arrange different programs to inculcate social welfare in students and to provide service to society without bias. Both the units arrange camps for social works like blood donation, awareness of public health and environment, tree plantation, etc. NSS volunteers of the college participate in the Republic day parade both at State and Central levels. The NSS units adopted ward number 88 and 36 of Asansol Municipal Corporation as part of their institutional social responsibility.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION:

The T.D.B. College Alumni Association, Raniganj was established on 7th July, 2007. The Alumni Association comprises exstudent members from different walks of life. The association has been raising funds and has also launched a number of academic, social and cultural programs including a Health Awareness camp.

The Alumni Association provides free educational facility to 30 meritorious but financially weak students every year. The association also felicitates students securing 1st, 2nd and 3rd positions in the college in university examinations.

The Alumni association has also provided fresh drinking water facility for the college students and staff.

The president and secretary of the association are Sri Krishna Gupta and prof. Atanu Roy respectively.

SPORTS:

In its quest for promoting holistic development of students, the college encourages its students to participate in Sports. Such participation nurtures not only physical dexterity, athleticism and a spirit of competition but also social interaction. The college authority organizes annual sports every year.

The college has the privilege to host the First Women's Athletic Meet (for both UG and PG) organized by the Kazi Nazrul University in Feb 2016. In 2018, our college also organised the games and sports championship of KNU, Asansol. We take pride for being the champions in the Women's Badminton District Meet- 2017. In 2018, our college also organised the District-level Inter-College Games and Sports meet, sponsored by DPI, (Higher Education) Govt. of W.B.

ENVIRONMENT FAIR:

We take the proud privilege to host the first "District Environment Fair-2019" of Paschim Bardhaman, sponsored by the office of the District Magistrate and Collectorate, (Govt. of W.B.)

SCHOLARSHIP / AWARDS / CONCESSION AND AIDS:

Financial aids of the following categories are provided to the economically backward and meritorious students each year.

- Govt. Scholarship: stipend for SC/ST students and national scholarships for the meritorious students are sanctioned by the government.
- 2. Students Aid Fund: This fund helps the poor meritorious students to submit their University Examination fees.
- **3. Free Studentship :** Full & half free concession is granted to economically backward and meritorious students as per government rules.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC):

The Internal Quality Assurance cell (IQAC) has been established in the college at the instance of the National Assess ment and Accreditation council (NAAC), Bangalore, as a post-accreditation quality sustenance measure. T.D.B. College has set up its Internal euality Assurance cell (IQAC) as a part of institution's system to ensure a heightened level of clarity and focus in institutional functioning towards quality enhancement and excellence in higher education. IQAC plays a pivotal role to promote measures for the functioning of the institution to build a better internal communication. It is headed by the principal of the college including teachers, non-teaching staff, members from local society and industry. IQAC acted as a dynamic system towards the NAAC accreditation of the college.

GUIDELINES RELATTING TO ADMISSION TO B.A. / B.SC. / B. COM. (HONOURS AND PROGRAM) COURSES OF STUDIES FOR THE ACADEMIC SESSION

The objective of the following guidelines is to make the admission merit based, hassle free and transparent

- These Guidelines shall be called the Kazi Nazrul University Admission guidelines relating to Three year B.A. / B.Sc./ B. Com (Honours and Programme) Degree Courses of Studies.
- 2. These shall apply to every candidate pursuing the above courses in this University.
- These Guidelines are effective from the Academic Session (current).

ADMISSION CRITERIA (FOR B.A. / B.SC. / B. COM. (HONOURS AND PROGRAM) COURSES

- 4. Candidates passing the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination with 5 (Five) recognized subjects including at least one language subject having full marks not being less than 100 is eligible to seek admission to the B.A./ B.Sc. / B. Com (Honours and Program) Course of Studies.
- 5. Candidates who have passed Higher secondary or equivalent examination (10+2 level) from any approved council or Board or University in the year 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020 are eligible for the admission in the under graduate courses. Admission into the under graduate courses will be made on the basis of merit and in accordance to the rules bid by the W.B. Govt. and KNU.
- Candidates who have passed the Higher secondary (10+2) Vocational examination conducted by the West Bengal
 in State council of Vocational Education and Training shall be eligible to seek admission to the Programme course
 of Studies.
- 7. A Candidate taking up Programme Course must have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination.
- 8. A candidate taking up Honours course in a subject must have obtained.
 - A minimum of 45% marks in the aggregate at the qualifying examination provided all other clauses are satisfied. For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission in Honours course, it is to be noted that total marks obtained by a candidate in Higher secondary or equivalent examination has to be calculated by summing up the marks of 4 subjects (excluding Environmental studies) in which the candidate has secured highest, among which exactly one must be a language subject. If the subject "Environmental Science" is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.

- Seat reservation in the degree courses of studies shall be guided by the:
 West Bengal State Higher Educational Institution (Reservation in Admission), Act 2013.
 West Bengal State Higher Educational Institution (Reservation in Admission) Rules, 2014.
 West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions policy of reservation to Persons with Disabilities.
- 10. A state or national level sports person may be considered for admission to Honours Courses under sports quota if found eligible.

Further, a district or state or national level sports person with pass marks in H.S. Examination may be considered for admission in Programme courses under sports quota.

Admission to Sports Quota will be guided by the relevant Government order in this regard.

- 11. Candidates who have qualified (10+2) or equivalent examinations from foreign Universities or boards are also eligible for admission to any affiliated colleges. They can apply for the 5% of the total seats allotted for the under graduate courses of the concerned college.
- 12. The students who are admitted in the under graduate courses may apply for the change in the subject within 3 weeks from the commencement of the classes.
- 13. Inter College transfer is not permissible except in special cases with the approval of the University Authorities
- 14. No Registered Undergraduate student of this University shall pursue any other full time regular course of study leading to a degree simultaneously in this University or any other university.
- 15. For the B.A. / B.Sc. / B. Com. (Honours and Program) course or studies Kazi Nazrul University offers the following subjects. For the details of the subjects (both UG and PG under KNU and NSOU) visit our website www.tdbcollege.ac.in.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- 1. Years of passing should be considered as 2020 (current year) and retrospective years 2017, 2018 and 2019 altogether only four years.
- 2. Minimum marks for eligibility at H. S.(10+2) Examination should be fixed at 45% for admission in Hons. Courses and 30% for admission in Programme Courses.
- All vocational/Engineering/Technology and Agriculture course passed candidates at (I0+2) level must secure pass marks in Mathematics to take admission in Programme Courses of B.Sc. (Pure Sc.) and B.A. All vocational / Business Studies / commerce passed candidates can take admission at B.Com. (programme) courses. All vocational home science passed candidates can take admission at B.Com. (Programmed Courses).

4. Reservation Status of Different Categories

OBC A - 10%, SC - 22%

OBC B - 07%, ST - 06%

5. Admission Criteria:

A candidate taking up Honours Course in a subject must have obtained:

Minimum of 45% marks in the aggregate at the previous qualifying examination provided all other clauses are satisfied.

PH - 3%

ALO;

For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission in Honours Course, it is to be noted that total marks obtained by a candidate in Higher Secondary or equivalent examination has to be calculated by summing up the marks of 4 subjects, (excluding Environmental Studies, if compulsory) in which the candidate has secured highest among which exactly one must be a language subject. If the subject 'Environmental Science' is studies as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.

A candidate taking up Programme Courses must have the subject in the previous qualifying examination and has passed in the previous examination.

Some special conditions for admission to Honours Courses as follows:

- (i) **Mathematics**: A candidate shall be allowed to take up Honours in Mathematics if he/she has passed in Mathematics of the previous qualifying examination. A candidate who has passed in Business Mathematics is not eligible for admission to the Mathematics Honours Course.
- (ii) **Chemistry / Physics :** A candidate shall be allowed to take-up Honours in Chemistry / Physics if he/she has passed in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination.
- (iii) **Bio-Chemistry**: A candidate shall be allowed to take up Honours in Bio-Chemistry if he/she has passed in Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Biology / Bio -Technology at the previous qualifying examination.
- (iv) **Physiology:** A candidate shall be allowed to take-up Honours in Physiology if he/she has passed the subject Physiology / Bio-Technology and Chemistry in the previous qualifying examination. The subject Biology /Bio-Technology may be treated as the related subjects.

- (v) **Nutrition**: A candidate shall be allowed to take-up Honours in Nutrition if he / she has passed in Chemistry at the previous qualifying examination.
- (vi) Computer Science: A candidate shall be allowed to take-up Honours in Computer Science if he/she has passed in Mathematics or Physics or Statistics or Electronics at the previous qualifying examination.
- (vii) **Geology**: A candidate shall be allowed to take-up Honours in Geology if he/she has passed in Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination.

Documents Required to be uploaded at the time of Registration and form fill up

- * Admit card of Secondary /Madhyamik Examination as age proof.
- * Marksheet of Higher Secondary (10+2) or Equivalent Examination.
- * Caste Certificate (*Certificate issued by an official below the rank of an SDO is not acceptable). However, Caste Certificate of other states is not acceptable.
- * Certificate of physicaly handicapped/differentially abled candidates in original, issued by Chief Medical Officer of Health (CMOH), Govt, of West Bengal.
- * Verification of documents will be done only when the students report for the classes in due course. Admission will be cancelled if the documents will be found not in conformity with the declaration in the form submitted online.


